Based on the results of the examinations and according to Article 20(1) of the Testing Regulations MedBG (SR 811.113.3), Article 5, 7, 9, 11, 14, 16 and 19 of the Testing Regulations MedBG (SR 811.113.32), the guidelines of the Commission on Medical Professions concerning content, form, timing and validation of the Federal Examination (www.bag.admin.ch), as well as the terms of reference of the Commission on Medical Professions to perform those Federal Examinations (www.bag.admin.ch) therefore

decree:

1. The Federal Examination in human medicine has **passed / failed**
2. If the examinee fails to pass the Federal Examination, only the failed individual examinations (including all containing component examinations) have to be repeated.

Instruction on the right to appeal

An appeal for this decree can be made through an administrative procedure (SR 172.021 (VwVG)) according to Federal Law Article 50 of 20 December 1968 within 30 days of delivery to the Federal Administrative Court, Postfach, 9023 St. Gallen, Switzerland.

The Appeal should contain the reasons including documentation of evidence and the signature of the appellant or their substitute; the appealed disposal (or the appealed decree) and the documentation of evidence needs to be enclosed (Article 52 VwVG).
